- It covers an area of 360 square Km.
- One of the fastest growing cities in Africa.
- Has an estimated population of 2.4 million people.
- 70% of population live in Peri-urban areas


















Food systems background for Lusaka

- Lusaka City is geographically small and does not produce sufficient food to meet its demand.
- The food is imported or supplied from regions outside the city.
 This entails that Lusaka City relies and will continue to highly rely on food produced from other towns.
- It therefore entails that in an event of disruption in the links between Lusaka and surrounding town, as seen during covid-19, the city would run the risk of high food insecurity levels.





Key Issues in Lusaka's Food System

- ➤ Lusaka City does not grow its own food
- >Lusaka food is mostly traded in informal markets
- ➤ Lusaka City is facing an emergence of modern supermarkets
- ➤ Lusaka City infrastructure in inadequate
- Lusaka City lacks a clear food waste disposal system
- Lusaka City lacks a clear food pricing mechanism and measurements





Lusaka Food Policy Council



- The Lusaka Food Policy Council (LFPC) was established to spearhead the food policy initiative.
- Its mandate is to implement the food policy initiative in order to have a functional food system in the city of Lusaka that ensures its residents have access to food that is;
